## Larking Gowen Ipswich Half Marathon 2025



On Sunday 21st September, Deb and Mel were once again up in the early hours to attend the Larking Gowen, Run for All Ipswich Half Marathon. With 8 runners taking part on behalf of Lighthouse, it was set to be yet another successful year. As ever, runners turned out in their hundreds to compete. A total of 2696 runners completed the course and we are happy to say that all 8 of our fabulous runners made it back in one piece. We were fortunate that the rain held off and the sun was at times, shining down on the runners.



Marathon records were smashed this year with the fastest time being set at 1 hour 8 minutes, and the fastest female came in at 1 hour 15 minutes an all time record for female competitors in the Ipswich Half. Again, we experienced such a positive vibe and atmosphere on the day. The marathon plays a vital role in our fundraising efforts for the charity and serves as a fantastic opportunity to boost our visibility within the local community. With participants and families coming from various locations, we engaged in meaningful conversations to raise awareness about the important work we do while discussing potential collaborations with other charities.



We would like to take the opportunity to thank all of our dedicated runners who took the time to train, fundraise and finish the course on behalf of Lighthouse. We have raised an amazing total of **£3023.00**.

## Women's Centre Update - By Jo Bigger, Service Manager

MARAC (Multi Agency Risk Assessment Conference) is a multi agency meeting where high risk cases of domestic abuse are heard across Suffolk. Agencies attending this conference include the Police, Domestic Abuse agencies, Social Care, Probation as well as other related professionals and charities. The aim of the meeting is to ensure the safety of high risk victims.

When clients come forward to our Women's Centre we will complete a risk assessment during their advice appointment. This is important as we need to ensure that we are aware of the amount of risk within the situation and that the correct help is put in place. We utilise the DASH - Domestic Abuse Stalking, and Honour based Violence tool, alongside our professional judgement and input from the client. If the client is deemed to be high risk, then the client is referred to the MARAC/ High risk support. The MARAC meetings are held in 3 areas of Suffolk to ensure that there are relevant agencies involved. At the meeting the case will be discussed, with the priority being that everything is completed to safeguard the victim and work being completed with the alleged perpetrator as required.

During an advice appointment with Lighthouse if the victim is deemed to be medium or standard risk, they can then be referred into Lighthouse services or onto other supporting agencies for help.

## Refuge Update - By Jo Bigger, Service Manager

The refuge has 15 bedrooms; some have connecting doors which allows us to take in larger families when needed. The refuge offers communal living with the families sharing bathrooms, kitchens, lounges, play areas and a garden. The top floor is only for women without children - either they don't have children, or they are not currently with them.

Women fleeing domestic abuse can have a variety of needs and it is important that we can match the living environment to support those needs.

When women first contact the refuge, we talk them through what our refuge is like as it is not always suitable for everyone, and we may look at alternative refuges that offer more comprehensive support around complex mental health needs or substance/alcohol misuse. At this point we will also complete a risk assessment to get a full picture of the domestic abuse situation and confirm that Ipswich is a safe location for her. We therefore don't take anyone from Ipswich or the surrounding areas, as they can too easily be traced - putting her and others at further risk.

Women come to us from across the country and we work hard to be an inclusive refuge, ensuring belief/religious and language needs are catered for. At present we are working closely with a local authority to support a woman and child who have no recourse to public funds and their refuge space is being supported by that authority.

# Mindful Moments at the Refuge by Naomi, Welfare Worker

Mindful Moments is a session run once a month in refuge. Residents are not obliged to attend, but the sessions have proved to be very popular.

The sessions offer an opportunity to have some time out, completing activities to support well-being and giving space and time to think. For many of the women in refuge this is their opportunity to take time to reflect and focus on themselves for a moment without distraction. Each week we get feedback from our residents and this input and our own ideas go into planning the activities for the next session.

The sessions are within a relaxing yet fun environment that is welcoming to all. Within the sessions our residents can enjoy the activities or use this as time to just catch up with others. With the chance to open up about their own experiences, offer comfort and support to one another and enjoy a laugh along the way. They provide a much-needed opportunity to escape the reality of being in refuge and the difficulties that can go with this.

Over the past few months, we have done origami, painting, and written positive affirmations on our reception area blackboard. Over the next few sessions, we are looking forward to getting crafty for Christmas and making some Christmas wreaths for each of the refuge doors.
