Minutes

Minutes of the Planning and Infrastructure Committee Meeting held on Wednesday 29 July 2026 in the Community Library, Norton Road, Thurston, commencing at 7.30pm

Present: Cllrs. Allen, Balaam, Dashper (in the Chair), Marsh, Morris, Rainbow, and West.

Also in attendance: Mrs Border, Clerk; Mrs Waples, Responsible Finance Officer; Richard Fawcett, member of the NDP Review Team; and Andrea Long of Compass Point Planning and Rural Consultants.

No members of the public were in attendance.

1. OPENING OF THE MEETING

The Chair formally opened the meeting at 7.30pm, advising all that the Protocol adopted by the Parish Council for reporting at Parish Council Meetings, would be taken as read.

2. APOLOGIES

- a) Council to receive apologies for absence – verified apologies for absence were received from Cllr Millett
- b) Council to consent to accept apologies received - Council resolved to accept the apologies submitted

3. DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS FROM COUNCILLORS INCLUDING GIFTS OF HOSPITALITY EXCEEDING £50 –

- a) To receive declarations of disclosable pecuniary interests; other registerable and non-registerable interests as detailed in Appendix B of the LGA Model Code of Conduct – there were no interests declared for the meeting
- b) To receive notification of gifts or hospitality exceeding £50 – there were none submitted.
- c) To note the determination of requests for dispensations in accordance with Council's Dispensation Policy – there were none to be reported as having been determined

4. THURSTON NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

- a) Receive and approve the new and updated policies from Andrea Long, Compass Point Planning and Rural Consultants Andrea Long, of Compass Point Planning and Rural Consultants
 - i. Members reviewed version three of the draft Neighbourhood Plan policies. The revisions strengthen the overall development strategy and include amendments relating to housing, design, community facilities, transport, parking, landscape, biodiversity and green spaces, together with new policies on infrastructure, climate change, heritage, and business and employment. It was noted that several policies remain subject to further consultation and supporting evidence, including but not limited to, highways and the increased use of junctions within

- the village, the character assessment, design code and identification of additional local green spaces and heritage assets
- ii. Council agreed that the policies should be refined further before consultation and that the consultation questions should be considered and confirmed.
 - iii. Council also agreed to consider formal public consultation could potentially start in February 2027 subject to a proposed and agreed timeline. Andrea agreed to prepare a timeline for the next stages of the Neighbourhood Plan and to review and suggest potential consultation questions
 - iv. It was noted that Suffolk County Council's call for sites is expected to take place in the autumn. Council to consider a community consultation in autumn 2026, noting that Mid Suffolk District Council's Call for Sites assessment may not be available and that the consultation may therefore need to be based on the Council's own assessment of the sites submitted. Council also noted that the Regulation 14 consultation under the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 could be scheduled for February 2027.
 - v. A query was raised regarding the progression of the sports and leisure facilities project manager appointment. It was reported that the consultant's work will progress alongside the Neighbourhood Plan process. It was advised that the tender for the leisure facilities project is due to be issued in August 2026 to those organisations that have expressed an interest and provided updated information to date. The tender period will remain open for six weeks, with a submission deadline of mid-September. Following evaluation of the responses received, a preferred proposal will be presented to full council for approval in October

 - i) It was resolved to delegate authority to Officers to submit a response on behalf of the Council, based on the Council's previous comments and representations. During discussion, concerns raised included reliance on Thurston railway station and associated travel patterns; transport links to the A14 via surrounding villages; highway issues at Mount Road, Sow Lane and Fishwick Corner; the lack of a continuous pedestrian and cycle route between the airfield development and Sow

Lane; the cumulative impact of a proposed 500-dwelling development alongside existing and planned developments; the implications for local school provision, notwithstanding proposals for a new primary school; the absence of health and wellbeing facilities; and concerns regarding proposed speed limits and traffic management measures
