

THURSTON PARISH COUNCIL

MINUTES of the COUNCIL MEETING held on Wednesday 4th March 2026 in the Community Library, Norton Road, Thurston which commenced at 7.00pm.

Present: Cllrs. Rainbow (in the Chair), Allen, Balaam, Bond, Gerrish, Marsh, Millest, Morris, Moy, Smith and West.

Also in attendance: County Cllr. Otton; Mrs Waples, Clerk and Mrs Gladwell, Deputy Clerk and one member of the public.

1. **OPENING OF THE MEETING** – the Chair formally opened the meeting at 7.00pm and the Protocol adopted by the Parish Council for reporting at Parish Council Meetings was read out by the Chair. 2. **APOLOGIES** –
 - a) Council to receive apologies for absence – verified apologies for absence were received from Cllrs. Dashper and Hamel-Cooke.
 - b) Council to consent to accept apologies received - **Council consented to accept the apologies submitted, aif.** Council also noted the submission of apologies from District Cllrs. Bradbury and Richardson and PCSO Brown.
 - c) To receive information on the six-month rule and apologies for absence and disqualification – all noted the provisions of section 85 of the Local Government Act 1972 in relation to failure to attend any meeting of the authority for six months unless the failure was due to some good reason approved by the authority before the six months had ended.
3. **DECLARATIONS OF INTERESTS FROM COUNCILLORS INCLUDING GIFTS OF HOSPITALITY EXCEEDING £50** –
 - a) To receive declarations of disclosable pecuniary interests; other registerable and non-registerable interests as detailed in Appendix B of the LGA Model Code of Conduct – there were no interests declared for the meeting.
 - b) To receive notification of gifts or hospitality exceeding £50 – there were none submitted.
 - c) To note the determination of requests for dispensations in accordance with Council’s Dispensation Policy – there were none to be reported as having been determined.
4. **MINUTES OF THE FOLLOWING MEETINGS:** *(all as previously circulated):*
 - a) To receive and approve the minutes of the following meeting:
Meeting of 4th February 2026 – **it was resolved to approve the minutes as previously circulated and to give consent for the Chair to sign the minutes after the meeting as a true and accurate record of the proceedings that took place outside of the meeting, aif.**
5. **PUBLIC FORUM:** *at the direction of the Chair, matters will either be responded to or deferred for further discussion and/or debate.*
 - a) To receive comments from members of the public on the agenda submitted – there were none submitted.
To receive comments from members of the public on matters relating to Thurston – the representative from the Ben Wragge Charity spoke and raised the following points: working for 10 years to get a skatepark / wheeled facility in the village. Part of the Open Space survey response showed that there was support for a wheeled facility. The charity would be prepared to give over money it held to progress a skatepark further if this was the intention of the parish council. Could the parish council confirm that it will be looking to involve the local groups in the appraisal of the plan as opposed to once the review has been completed. The Clerk confirmed that it was the intention of the council to involve a variety of groups in the consultation process once the review was further underway. The Clerk agreed to liaise with the Professional Advisors as to timescales to bring these discussions into the public forum.

- 6. REPORTS FOR INFORMATION** – the following reports were submitted: all of which can be viewed under Appendix C and D – (separate file).
- Report from County Councillor Penny Otton – the written report was taken as read.
 - The following matters were brought to the attention of the meeting:
 - SCC will now be holding elections in May.
 - Library service is to be reviewed by the Scrutiny Committee.
 - Grit bins – the Clerk advised that the requests had been for non-adopted roads and these would be reconsidered once the roads had been adopted by SCC.
 - SCC Policy to be enacted on road clearance during planned roadworks – in essence if a road is due to be resurfaced, residents will be advised when the work is to be carried out so that cars can be removed prior to commencement of work. If cars are not moved, they will be removed at a cost to the resident.
- Cllr. Otton left the meeting at this point in the agenda.*
- Report from District Cllr. Harry Richardson – the written report was taken as read. There were no matters for onward referral.
- 7. POLICE MATTERS**
- a) To receive a report from PCSO Brown, the match funded PCSO from Stowmarket Community Policing Team (CPT) on crimes relating to Thurston – the written report from PCSO 3362 Brown covering the month of February 2026 was circulated to all Councillors. There were nineteen crimes recorded in the area for the month of February. During the last month work in the area has been completed in identifying suspects in crimes that have occurred in relation to shop lifting and burglary; attended to road traffic matters in relation to disqualified drivers, uninsured and speeding in the parish. Work has also been undertaken with the schools regarding anti-social behaviour happening in the area affecting vulnerable people and engagement with vulnerable people and other partner agencies such as Social Services, Housing Associations and schools is ongoing.
 - b) To consider matters for referral to Stowmarket CPT – there were no matters for onward referral.
- 8. STATUTORY BUSINESS:**
- a) BMSDC - Consultation on the Sustainability Appraisal Scoping Report for the Babergh and Mid Suffolk Joint Local Plan Review – it was agreed that the Clerk would review the written report and comment on the percentage of affordable housing applied by the district for each development given the difficulties locally in filling the properties.
 - b) Councillors to receive information relating to email and security arrangements – in accordance with Proper Practices all were reminded that the council had a gov.uk domain name that supported emails for officers as well as councillors. Having authority owned email accounts also made Data Subject Access and Freedom of Information Requests easier to manage. Each councillor was given their new email address with specific log-in details. Basic information on how to set up the email account on MS Office (Basic License) was given to all councillors present. All reminded that the use of the email address for official business was covered by the council's IT policy, Data Protection Policy and Document and Data Retention Policy.
- 9. TO RECEIVE REPORTS FROM THE FOLLOWING COMMITTEE(S):**
- a) Environment and Biodiversity Committee Meeting – no meeting held in February.
 - b) Open Spaces and Leisure Committee Meeting – no meeting held in January.
 - c) Policy and Resources Committee meeting – to note the draft minutes and to receive a report from 18th February 2026 – the draft minutes were noted, and the Clerk provided a resume of the meeting that took place including year-end review of financial risk and general policies and protocols.
 - d) Planning and Infrastructure committee meeting – to note the draft minutes and to receive a report from the meeting of 18th February 2026 – the draft minutes were noted with confirmation that two minor applications were considered.
 - e) Emergency Planning Committee meeting – to note the draft minutes and to receive a report from 25th February 2026 – the draft minutes were noted, and the Deputy Clerk provided a summary of the matters covered: spring survey of Pakenham Stream, reviewed areas prone to flooding, ongoing review of the levels in the grit bin levels and revisions to the adopted Emergency Plan.

- f) Biodiversity Open Day Working Group - to receive an update from the meeting held on 27th February 2026 – the Deputy Clerk provided an update confirming that the meeting in the main covered logistics of how the day would run: the council would run a bird box stand, 178 boxes had been purchased; installation of the boxes will be a separate project for the Autumn; Scouts Group were on board; large maps would be printed and would be on hand to allow for areas to be chosen; marketing and advertising were also in hand; the day would also see the launch of a photo competition on the day with workshops describing how best to take a photo along the biodiversity theme. Donations had been offered from local companies for the larger bird boxes.

10. TO CONSIDER MATTERS / RECOMMENDATIONS ARISING FROM COMMITTEE MEETINGS:

- a) To receive confirmation from the Policy and Resources Committee that the annual review of the council's financial risk assessment and internal controls has now been completed (*P&R Draft Minutes– 18.02.26*) - the meeting noted the draft minutes and the processes relating to year-end that had been carried out by the committee under delegated powers.
- b) To receive and ratify the recommendation by the Policy and Resources Committee of the appointment of Mr Trevor Brown as Internal Auditor for the year ending 31st March 2026 (*Paper – Appointment of Internal Auditor – 05.03.25*) – having reviewed the paper submitted, it was **resolved to accept the recommendation of the Policy and Resources Committee and appoint Mr Trevor Brown to carry out the internal audit on Thurston Parish Council for the year ending 31st March 2026 at a cost of £600 plus pro rata travelling expenses at the prevailing HMRC rate.**
- c) To receive and consider the recommendation from the Emergency Planning Committee to accept the following proposals:
- amendments to be incorporated into Appendix M of the Emergency Plan – **it was resolved to accept the recommendation from the Committee that the amendments to Appendix M be approved, and the Emergency Plan be updated to include the changes.**
 - amendments to be incorporated into Appendix B of the Emergency Plan - **it was resolved to accept the recommendation from the Committee that the amendments to Appendix B be approved, and that The Hedgerows, Hakewell Mews and Thurston Grove be added to the councillor list and the Emergency Plan be updated to include the changes.**
 - Appendix L be removed from the Emergency Plan as not relevant to the implementation of an Emergency – **it was resolved to accept the recommendation to remove Appendix L from the Appendices of the Emergency Plan.** It was acknowledged that the information was of use and should be disseminated to parishioners via the village newsletter, social media and the website.

11. TO CONSIDER MATTERS RELATING TO PLANNING:

- a) to receive a summary of email correspondence with the Professional Advisor and Statutory Consultee discussions – the meeting was made aware that the consultant, given the publication of indicative housing figures by MSDC in March 2025 and more recently the completion of the MSDC Call for Sites process, had commenced initial conversations with statutory consultees in relation to site assessments. The aim was to allow the parish council the ability to commence the assessment of the suitability of sites put forward through the MSDC Call for Sites process in 2024, 2025 and 2026. It was also noted that some sites originally submitted in the 2024 Call for Sites now have the benefit of planning permission, were under construction or even occupied and therefore not all sites shown on the MSDC maps are therefore available for allocation in the Thurston Neighbourhood Plan Review. It was also noted that two of the sites that had been put forward for housing had now been submitted for commercial use as well.
- b) Update on PROW Footpath 24 – The Clerk confirmed that the Green Access Development Officer had provided an update on the footpath/bridleway that was to run west of Barton Road to Heath Road in which it was stated that the landowners and parties interested in the land have agreed on the alignment for the bridleway. Legal matters were still being addressed, which may include compensation and legal fees.
- c) Legal agreements for DC/23/02429 – whilst the council and the landowners had signed their respective documents for the transfer of the land including the s106 and s111 agreements, this was now being held up by MSDC due to issues over an access onto the nature reserve area from Pakenham Road. The confusion appeared to stem from misinformation given at the planning meeting in which a new

access point was discussed on Pakenham Road. This has caused the planning committee to come to an incorrect recommendation which the legal team was trying to address. All connected to the land had previously confirmed that this access had been in existence for in excess of 20+ years and was the only access onto the field and should therefore be retained for maintenance purposes.

12. TO CONSIDER MATTERS RELATING TO FINANCE:

- a) To approve the accounts awaiting payment including those coming forth (*Paper 1 – 04.03.26*) - the items awaiting payment were verified and explanations given where appropriate. **It was resolved that council approve those items as submitted under Paper 1 and as detailed in Appendix B, for payment.**
- b) To note the accounts paid since the last meeting (*Paper 2 – 04.03.26*) - **the meeting resolved to retrospectively approve those payments that had been made away from the meeting as detailed under Paper 2 as seen in Appendix B.**
- c) To note receipts allocated since the last meeting (*Paper 3 – 04.03.26*) - Council noted the receipt of monies received as identified at Appendix B.
- d) To receive the bank reconciliation for the period ending 28th February 2026 (*Paper 4 – 04.03.26*) - all noted the confirmed bank balances of £847,749.23 across all accounts held in the name of the Parish Council at the end of January 2026. Cllr. Balaam confirmed that he had reviewed the statement of accounts for the month of March and there were no matters of concern.
- e) To receive the statement of accounts for the period ending 28th February 2026 (*Paper 5 – 04.03.26*) - the meeting received the statement of accounts for the period ending 28th February 2026 in the sum of £849,766 noting Working General Reserves stood at £8,964; Contingency General Reserves stood at £54,405 and Earmarked Reserves stood at £786,397.
- f) To note the CIL report for February 2026 including nominal sums for potential CIL expenditure for the coming year and receipts received (*Paper 6 – 04.03.26 and Paper 6a – 04.02.26*) – Council noted the paper submitted showed receipts for the year at £691,330 with expenditure in the sum of £71,292 incurred to date. Committed expenditure was noted as £50,628. The meeting was reminded of the potential CIL monies due to be paid over to the council in April 2026, which were currently £301,981 (04.03.2026).
- g) To consider a further request for a donation for the year 2025-2026 (*Paper 7 – 04.03.26*) – **it was resolved to award a donation in the sum of £288 to the Tiny Toes Toddler Group in Thurston.**
- h) To note changes to fees and charges and reduction in interest rates for the accounts held by the council– the meeting was informed of the following interest rate changes: Unity Instant Access existing rate 2.12% AER, new rate 23.03.26 1.96% AER; Redwood Bank existing rate 3.75% new rate 29.03.26 3.50% and 3.25%AER from 30 May 2026. Account charges for Unity Bank would be changing as follows: Current monthly fee increases from £6.00 to £7.00 and Bacs charges per transaction from 14p to 15p.

13. COUNCILLOR REPORTS:

- a) To report village matters of concern to the Clerk –
 - Trees on Thurston Park – these had now been ordered.
 - Pathway in footway to Church Road – glass fragments in pathway have been investigated and it appears that the pathway should have been resurfaced as it currently only has a base coat. This would be down to Denbury Homes to rectify.
 - Grange Park – missing trees have been planted but dead trees have not yet been replaced.
 - Dog bag dispensers – empty in some cases.
 - Bus Stop sign on the lamppost on Double Road, College Park – damaged and missing.
 - College Park – dead / damaged trees by play area.
 - Library sign at top of Norton Road – pointing in wrong direction.
- b) To receive items for information only from parish council appointed representatives on outside bodies/groups:
 - New Green – meeting held the previous week – purchase of new chairs in abeyance; Inpost discussed; floor in the main hall is to be ground and polished; new face book page to be launched; CCTV system to be upgraded.
 - Cavendish Hall – no meeting held since the last parish council meeting. Fund raising event on Friday. AGM held in February.

- Library - new chairs imminent; dishwasher has been connected; concerns over the future of Libraries and SCC's input; discussion to be had by monies held by Suffolk Libraries.
 - Thurston Community Players – went well, attended by over 500 people.
- c) To receive reports from councillors on meetings attended and training events attended – there were no matters to report.

14. CLERK'S REPORT – to receive and consider information from the Clerk and Deputy Clerk and in particular:

- a) To receive the reports of items actioned under delegated powers:
MSDC – removal of sign from within the curtilage of a resident's garden; reporting of potholes generally; reporting of significant potholes within the confines of land at The Granary; reporting of missing parking instruction sign and bollards on The Granary – confirmed as not being replaced; reporting of faulty lights along Ixworth Road.
And matters being progressed:
MSDC and the elections for SCC; seminars / discussions in relation to LGR (decision still awaited from awaiting HM Government as to the option to be followed).
- b) To note correspondence, receive on HM Government's decisions to go ahead with Suffolk County Council and Ipswich Borough Council elections in May 2026 – all noted that the elections for these areas would now go ahead. The date was confirmed as being 7th May 2026.
- c) To receive items of correspondence for noting only – it was confirmed that all matters relating to the following had been previously circulated to councillors

 - SALC – Training Bulletins
 - MARPA

- Persimmon Homes – the Clerk provided a verbal update confirming the following matters that had been discussed: 14 private dwellings are now occupied with 6 affordable having been passed over to the Housing Association. Final affordable housing to be handed over in June with final market completions expected at the end of 2026. TRO for speed extension awaiting technical approval. Council's concerns over enhanced play equipment being considered. Failed planting across both developments being remedied by a different contractor. Council are being asked to approve the location of the dog waste bin on College Park with a commuted sum for its emptying to be paid over to the parish council.
 - Barrett David Wilson Homes – 27th February 2026 – to note this meeting was postponed by the Clerk due to time constraints in the office.
- b) To confirm the dates of the next Parish Liaison meetings: all were encouraged to attend these meetings

- a) To receive an update on the recruitment process for the Proper Officer / Clerk to the Parish Council – the Clerk advised that the Policy and Resources Committee were now in the process of shortlisting for interview. Details of the interview format were shared with the Council.
 - b) To discuss further the request to site an Inpost Locker in the front car park of the New Green Centre – whilst the Crime Out Officer had confirmed that they had received the Clerk’s request for guidance, this was still to be received due to time constraints. As soon as the Clerk had the information and any recommendations, these would be shared with New Green Community Trust.
 - c) To discuss the request to site an additional shed adjacent to the three located at the rear of the Parish Council Office on New Green Centre Open Space – following a review of the information provided, **the Council agreed that, whilst it supported the principle, it was advisable to wait until discussions over the future plans for the centre were more advanced.** This would be communicated to the Trustees of the New Green Community Centre Trust.
